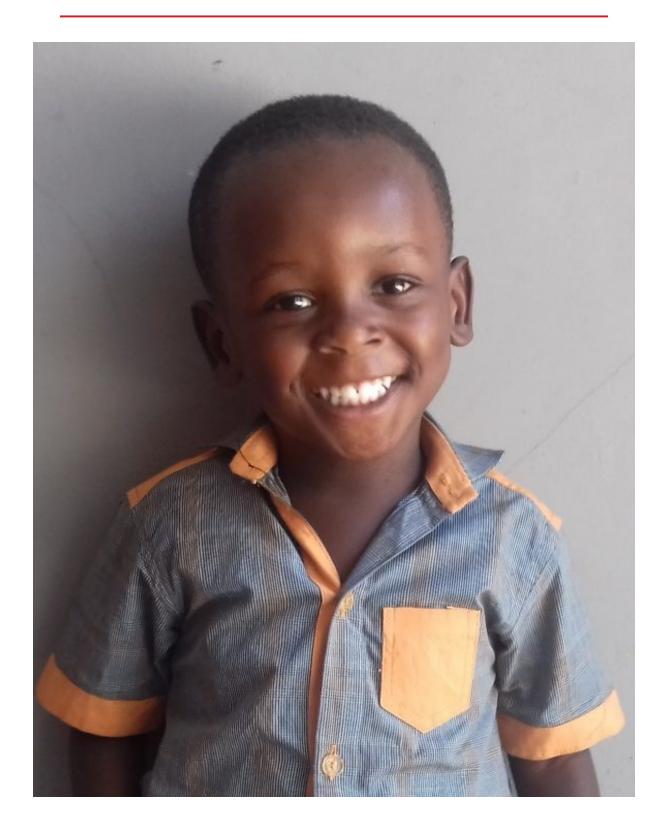


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MANAGEMENT REPORT

Friends of PAAJAF

In the year under consideration - 2020, we were able to have PAAJAF registered as a charity in the United States of America on April 2020 at North Carolina as a 501(c)(3) registered non-profit charity by three former PAAJAF Foundation volunteers as Friends of PAAJAF.

The Friends of PAAJAF (FOP) mission is to provide pedagogical, operational, legal, and marketing support for PAAJAF Foundation in Ghana. Its presence in the U.S. facilitates access to a more extensive range of grant and fundraising channels. By establishing Friends of PAAJAF as a registered non-profit, the U.S. affiliate organization enables American donors to make tax-deductible donations and opens up new doors for U.S. grants.

OPERATIONAL RESULTS

During the foundation operations in 2020, we have managed to register the PAAJAF affiliate in the United States of America. In 2021, our goal is to expand our reach. We will strive to register our organization in one of the following countries: the United Kingdom, France or Switzerland.

All programs and projects were on-hold due the lack of funding and the COVID-19 pandemic. The education program was active from the beginning of January 2020 to March 2020. Before the COVID-19 outbreak, the total number of students on the education program stood at 91.

In terms of inflow and outflow, we have a total amount GH¢ 78,222.05. It was registered an income representing US\$ 13,987.29, and an expenditure of GH¢ 76,753.00 (US\$ 13,705.89). A positive variance of GH¢ 1,469.05 (US\$ 281.40) was also recorded. The expenditure excludes a depreciation of GH¢ 2,820.30, representing US\$ 503.63.

Comparing the year 2020 and 2019 figure in table above, 2020 expenditure was a bit closer to the 2019's one. One may ask why since the programs are closed. The answer is that the programs were suspended from the normal administration activities to support teachers and students when set up at home.

PROGRAMS

PAAJAF provides charitable services in line with its mission to support children, youth, and adults in Ghana. The projects are focus on different areas such as education, child welfare, and youth resilience. The current programs are listed below:

















Our Education program (PAAJAF School (PEI)) embraces a holistic educational approach while providing an inviting and safe space for our community. We proudly see our students taking new steps towards fresh directions in life each year. Our educational programs also focus on providing prevention education about communicable diseases, healthy hygiene habits, sports, and emotional wellbeing for students and their parents.

PAAJAF aims to educate children on the importance of the environment and natural resource preservation. Students learn about important issues and their inherent risks in a global context. Students will also learn to take an environment-oriented approach in their daily life. Children are the best influencers of their families.

They can have a significant impact on their community. We will work with all NGOs and organizations on this topic to ensure greater access to understanding and education. Students will see the direct impact of environmental issues and be involved in research and creating solutions.

To base our program for a child, PAAJAF understands that our school must provide a safe space to learn and a high-quality education that promotes inclusiveness. Our priorities are to provide quality education, space for playing, healthy meals, and sanitation facilities. PAAJAF also wants to ensure teachers have the proper equipment to teach diverse students that learn at their own pace.
